Water Quality Monitoring in Brown County

In 2014, a Minnesota Statue was passed providing funds for aquatic invasive species prevention. The Brown County commissioners and the Brown Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) signed a delegation agreement that put the SWCD in charge of managing the funds. With this funding, the SWCD generates an annual Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Plan that incorporates education and outreach along with monitoring and prevention strategies.

This past Spring, with the help of a consultant, the SWCD developed the Brown County Aquatic Invasive Species Management Plan: 2019-2023. Historical monitoring data was compiled to help determine what data gaps need to be filled with our monitoring efforts. The four waterbodies within Brown County that are included in the monitoring plan include Sleepy Eye Lake, Lake Hanska, Wellner-Hageman Reservoir, and Clear Lake. Monitoring efforts include water quality sampling, water level monitoring, secchi disc readings, carp population assessments, submerged aquatic vegetation surveys in both late spring and late summer, and annual fish population assessments (performed by the MN DNR) and will be conducted on each of the water bodies throughout the five years. The data that is collected will be used to help determine if there are any AIS present within the county, what AIS threats are present, and will help us react to any new AIS since we will have a better understanding of the health of each water body.

Many parameters are assessed with the water quality monitoring. Water samples are collected once a month throughout the summer and sent to Minnesota Valley Testing Laboratories (MVTL) to determine the levels of total suspended solids, chlorophyll-a, soluble ortho-phosphorus, and total phosphorus. While on the lake, a handheld YSI meter is used to take readings of temperature, DO (%),

DO (mg/L), specific conductivity, pH, oxidation-reduction potential (ORP), and turbidity throughout the entire water column. The SWCD was able to complete five months of water quality sampling this past summer by pairing up with the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen club for the use of their boat. We are still working on compiling and analyzing all of this data.

Consultants were hired to conduct carp population surveys on both Clear Lake and Wellner-Hageman Reservoir. Common carp were found at both locations and their populations surpassed the impairment threshold. This means the population has exceeded the level at which they become damaging to the lake's ecosystem. However, each water body has very different communities. Wellner-Hageman Reservoir has a high density of mature carp, but it appears the population is being controlled by predation from the healthy native game fish population. Clear Lake, on the other hand, has a high density of young carp which suggests that the population comes from a single successful spawning event. Frequent kill events seem to be keeping most of the population under control, with only a few reproductive individuals surviving the kill events or re-populating the lake from downstream habitat. We will continue to monitor both water bodies until the end of our five-year monitoring period. Decisions about controlling the carp will be made once all of the data is compiled.

Monitoring efforts for 2020 will once again bring on new challenges and learning experiences for our team. Water quality monitoring will continue once a month throughout the summer. We can only hope that we will have as good of weather this year as we did in 2019. To remain on schedule, it is our plan to perform a Curly-leaf pondweed survey and a full submerged aquatic vegetation survey on
